

Impact of recurrent failure of artificial insemination on the female psychosexual life

This study aimed to elaborate the response of the infertile women to recurrent failure of artificial insemination and its impact on the psychosexual aspect of their marital status. The study was conducted on 50 women with recurrent failure. The sample was interviewed through constructed experienced a lot of psychological reaction after the failure of A. I. H. Putting many questions marks for their femininity and their marital life. 40% had expressed loss of hopes in life goals and future, while 38% mourn the loss of motherhood and 48% were frustrated. It was noticed that 38% of their husbands were unsupportive and 24% were dissatisfied about their marital life. As regards the sexual dysfunction 36% reported hypoactive sexual desire. It was also observed that 18% had no orgasm, while 36% had seldom experience of orgasm after the failure of A. I. H. Psychological and sexual counseling for such a couple can allow for more adaptive counseling for such a couple can allow for more adaptive responses and resolution conflicts by the health team working at the assisted reproductive department.
