

Psychiatric morbidity among children of patients with OCD

In this study, 40 parents with OCD and their children (99) were examined to detect the psychiatric morbidity among them. They were exposed to Layton obsession inventory child version (LOIchV) to detect the presence of OCD or OCS among them. Wechsler scale estimated the cognitive function of the children. The results showed that anxiety and depression were the most common pathology found among the children of OCD parents, followed by rituals and/or rumination and obsessive compulsive disorder. The cognitive functions of the children were impaired parallel to the level of obsessive symptoms and disorder among the children.
